Women military service members returning from deployment to the wars in Iraq and Afghanistan face gender-specific readjustment issues as they transition back to their local communities. This full-day workshop will provide an overview of the health/mental health concerns of women veterans within the context of military culture, gender-specific roles, available support resources and effective treatments.

Harold Kudler, MD

Dr. Kudler is Associate Clinical Professor in the Department of Psychiatry and Behavioral Sciences at Duke and the Mental Health Coordinator for Veterans Integrated Service Network (VISN), Number 6. In this capacity, he manages the Mental Health Service Line for eight VA Medical Centers and their outlying facilities across 3 states. Dr. Kudler's expertise in PTSD stems from clinical and research work with combat veterans, ex-prisoners of war, survivors of other traumatic events, and their families. Dr. Kudler was the founding Chairperson of the PTSD Practice Guidelines Task Force of the International Society for Traumatic Stress Studies (ISTSS) and was first author of that task force's Treatment Guideline for the Psychodynamic Treatment of PTSD

Elizabeth Marks

Ms. Marks is currently a student at the UNC Chapel Hill School of Social Work, anticipating graduating with an MSW in May and pursuing clinical work with veterans, service members, and their families. A 2002 graduate of the United States Naval Academy, she completed three sea deployments to the Arabian Gulf and throughout the Pacific. She also spent nine months in Baghdad, Iraq in 2007 as a Counter Improvised Explosive Device (IED) Officer for an Army Field Artillery battalion in support of Operation Iraqi Freedom (OIF).

Lt. CDR. Erin Simmons, PhD

Dr. Simmons is currently the staff psychologist and program director for the Intensive Outpatient PTSD program at the US Naval Hospital at Marine Corps Base Camp Lejeune. She has been stationed at Camp Pendleton, CA and Camp Fallujah, Iraq. Dr. Simmons has received numerous military awards including the Global War on Terrorism Expeditionary Medal with Eagle, Globe and Anchor; and the Global War on Terrorism Service Medal. She is a member of many professional organizations including the American Psychological Association, the Society for Psychotherapy Research and the International Institute for the Study of Traumatic Stress.

Kristy Straits-Troster, PhD, ABPP

Dr. Straits-Troster is an Assistant Professor in the Department of Psychiatry and Behavioral Sciences at Duke University as well as Assistant Clinical Director of the VA Mid-Atlantic Region's Mental Illness Research, Education and Clinical Center (MIRECC) based in Durham, NC and focused on post-deployment readjustment and mental health. Her clinical and research experience includes PTSD treatment, and prevention of chronic illness. Dr. Straits-Troster is currently conducting a Department of Defense-funded study on implementation of a multi-family group intervention for veterans with traumatic brain injury and their families.

Target Audience: Psychologists, therapists, counselors, social workers, substance abuse counselors, marriage and family therapists, psychiatric nurses, case managers, clergy, child care coordinators, school personnel, other healthcare professionals who provide services to female service members and their families.
